Course Description: Patient Profiles are configurable templates used to design and display patient level data using study environment-specific metadata. Patient Profiles provides the ability to generate data reporting documentation based on profile designs for various clinical trial roles, such as data managers or site managers, to review and interpret study data, or to submit data to regulatory authorities.
